FIELD DAY 1977 (TDXS vs. RWK)

This year's Field Day will be the biggest ever for the Texas DX Society. As many of you know, a challenge has been issued to the TDXS by the Richardson Wireless Klub and we have accepted! The challenge is for the three transmitter class. Because of the importance of this year's effort, Wes (K5RLW) and Richard (K5NA) have agreed to assist your Field Day Chairman, Don (N5DM) in coordinating the effort. This year, Field Day will fall on the weekend of June 25th and 26th.

If Field Day is to be a success, then all members must start planning right now! First off, start arranging time off from work for Thursday, June 23rd, and Friday, June 24th, and the weekend of June 25th - 26th. We need as many people there as early as possible. The idea is to have all stations ready to go by Friday afternoon so we can get the bugs out of the rigs. This will also eliminate the last-minute rush that we usually have Saturday morning.
